

Graduate Student Scholarship Opportunities

The Mathematics Department and University offer several additional opportunities for financial support for Ph.D. students.

Dean's Doctoral Fellowships

The fellowship is to be awarded to one incoming doctoral student in Mathematics beginning with the 2017-2018 academic year. It is a five-year fellowship with the first and fifth year Graduate Research Assistant (GRA) appointments and Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) appointments during the years 2, 3. Fellows receive a stipend (ranging between \$20,000-\$22,000) plus resident rate tuition and required fees for up to five years of doctoral study.

University Graduate Fellowships

The Mathematics Department has been awarded one fellowship to support a first-year domestic doctoral student from an underrepresented minority within mathematics (including women, first-generation college students, or students of Native American, African-American, or Latino/a heritage). The fellow will be appointed as a GRA during the first year and will work as a GTA in subsequent years. The salary, in addition to a waiver of up to nine hours of tuition, course and technology fees, is comparable to the typical math GTA.

Self Graduate Fellowships

The fellowship supports exceptional Ph.D. students in a number of areas, including mathematics, who demonstrate the promise to make significant contributions to their fields of study and society as a whole. Departments nominate applicants who have a record of academic excellence and who fit the [Self Graduate Fellow Profile](#). Self Graduate Fellows receive a stipend of \$30,500 per year for four years and participate in the unique [Fellow Development Program](#). The program is limited to US citizens.
