<u>Title</u>	Robert D. Adams Visiting Assistant Professor, non-tenure track
<u>Starting Date</u>	Appointments are expected to begin August 18, 2008
<u>Availability of Appointment</u>	Four positions are available.
<u>Length of Appointment</u>	These are term positions, initially for one academic year and renewable for a second year with the expectation that one additional one-year appointment is possible.
<u>Duties</u>	Classroom teaching (six credit hours per semester) and continuing research activity.
<u>Required Qualifications</u>	Ph.D. or terminal degree in Mathematics, or Computer Science, or related field expected by start date of appointment; commitment to excellence in teaching in mathematics as evidenced by teaching philosophy statement and/or reference letter on teaching; and commitment to excellence in research as evidenced by graduate coursework, dissertation research, publications, and/or externally funded research grants.
<u>Preferred Qualifications</u>	Candidates in scientific visualization and computer graphics. Candidates who contribute to the climate of diversity in the College, including a diversity of scholarly approaches.

<u>Review of Applications Or Nominations</u>	Initial review of applications will begin on December 1, 2007 and will continue until the position is filled. The successful applicant should have appropriate authorization to work in the U.S. before employment begins.
